

The triple disaster of the Tohoku earthquake, tsunami and nuclear meltdown has been the cause of tragic destruction, loss and trauma for the affected communities, surrounding areas, and for the country as a whole. This moment in Japan's history has created unique windows of opportunity for deepened democratization, critical thinking about gender, diversity and social vulnerability, and for civil society and women's active participation in the rebuilding of Tohoku and of Japan.
